II CORINTHIANS 3:7-18

**I. Our ministry is more glorious than that of Moses
(II Corinthians 3:7-8).**



- **How glorious would it have been to see the glory of God on Mt. Sinai?**
- **How is our ministry even more glorious?**

II. A ministry that brings life is much greater than one that brings death (v.9-11).

III. Our hope in our greater ministry brings boldness (v.12-13).

- **How can we make sure that we are not putting a veil on a fading glory?**
- **What changes need to take place so that we are seen as “very bold” in our ministry?**



IV. Instead of a fading, veiled ministry, ours offers freedom by the Spirit (II Corinthians 3:14-17).

- **In what way did a veil cover the hearts of those under the old covenant?**
- **What responsibilities come to us who are in this ministry that brings freedom?**

(II Corinthians 3:18).**



- **What is the greatest glory of this ministry?**
- **How intently are we beholding the glory of the Lord?**
